Hello St. Albert families,

This year's summer camp is going to be a total of 11 weeks. It will start on June 10th and last until August 16th. Summer camp is a fun and safe place for your kids to spend their summer. Some of the things we do include walking up to the Northwest Pool, bring in a rock wall, a talent show, a book club, overnight camps, and much more. Each week has its own unique theme. Our experienced staff is first-aid and CPR certified. We will send out a schedule the second week of May, of things we are doing each day throughout the summer.

Due to an increase in price for pool passes, we have increased our prices. Here is a list of our upgraded prices.

- Registration Fee: \$100
- One to Two Days of Camp: \$80
- Three Days of Camp: \$110
- Four to Five Days of Camp: \$150
- Pick up After 6:00PM (Late pick up): \$1 per minute (cash) and is paid to the staff who stayed late.

Summer Camp is open Monday – Friday from 7:00 AM – 6:00 PM. There is a late fee for picking up your child late as stated above, and we will be strict on it this summer due to increased late pickups last summer. IMMUNIZATION LAW

The Nevada School Immunization Law requires that children be up-to-date on their immunizations to attend school or child care centers. Because childhood diseases like measles can spread quickly, children need to be protected before they enter school. Most children need booster immunizations before entering Kindergarten. **An original up-to-date immunization record, issued by the Washoe County Health Department or a physician, must be on file in the school office prior to your child's first day of school.**
